### GLITZ Design Honour for Creative Excellence-2021 Architecture - Institutional

Honourable Mention: d6thD design studio, Ahmedabad Project : UDAN Crematorium, Amalsad, Gujarat



he 2-acre site has adjoining roads on the north and west side, a small river on the south side and a few residences on the east side. The site had a slopy terrain of 5mt. going down from north to the south-west. The architect strategically transformed half of the contoured site into two major levels- upper level for public space and lower level for cremation by a cut-and-fill method. Both the levels are connected with the ramp, considered as the ceremonial path.

Upon arrival at the entrance plaza from the northern road, visitors are persuaded to slow down with invisible buildings and offered multiple paths. However, the partly visible chimney and golden trident sparks curiosity. A driveway ramp on the west side leads down to a parking area and visitors can return to the plaza shortly by using a staircase connecting them both. The upper level is fully landscaped with various spiritual gardens acknowledging the fact that in the Indian context, society revolves around religion and such spaces often become more than just a place of devotion. Less conventionally, these spaces cater to all ages and genders regardless of the part of the crematorium complex, and the upper level becomes a significant public space for socio-cultural engagement.







"SKETCHES/IDEAS"

Nandivan and Sitavan on the lower west, while children play area and Vrindavan on the upper east side of the entrance plaza, help disperse the public mass. The snakeshaped wavy pathway leading down to an iconic Shivlinga on the extreme east provide a buffer between cremation courts and adjoining residential units. All these spaces were designed for daily use by locals and are carefully blended with landscape on

various levels to honour the

contoured site condition.



The journey will be passed through the namp going down having number of niches in wall depicting hindu god iddle



The language has a traditional village theme and will create a very pious and cultural otmosphere. Chimney has been personified as a soul release element.



The design intention was to create a vivid spatial sequence, beginning with a long approach through the tunnel in order to heighten anticipation of the statue, which is invisible from the outside

A 5mt. wide and 60mt. long ramp (Muktimarg) peculiarly carved out of contoured public park takes mourners down from the entrance plaza to the hidden crematorium. As one goes down gradually, retaining walls create a shaft effect. At the beginning of the ramp, retaining walls hold murals of different iconic structures of the local town (school, college, temple, market, railway station etc.) as a reminiscence of the departed. Small idols of various Hindu saints and their quotes displayed in retaining wall niches create a pious atmosphere to calm the relatives of the deceased. In the middle of the ramp, a bridge connecting two gardens on top with hanging creepers provides tranquillity. Continuous planters on the top edge of the retaining walls soften the visual impact and act as a security fence for the gardens.

Further, a curvilinear ramp reveals a grand lord Shiva sculpture which cannot be seen from entry-level. It recognizes the world and encapsulates it in the philosophy of creation, sustenance and destruction-symbolized by Trishula. To accentuate this, Lord Shiva is visually framed with elevated stone walls and the slab having golden trident at the end of the ramp.










Himanshu Patel is an ardent architect from M.S. University. Sunken courts at lower levels allow controlled relationships with the exterior and thus provide environments for reflection and remembrance. Hexagonal shaped two cremation pyres, arranged in a symmetrical pattern, give the possibility of two funerals at the same time with the sense of privacy.

The project encourages visitors to explore the different spaces and interpret their purpose through their own experiences and needs. By realising death as a motivating element to focus the meaning of life on both a personal and social level, this unique crematorium- "Udan" becomes an important public space for the town as well as the surrounding villages.

ocated in Kerala's Thrissur District, 'Mango house' thrives to inscribe minimalist modernity as its design language while sharing a humble relationship with its immediate vicinity. As the project name duly indicates, the salient feature of the design would be the site's resident old Mango tree which is wrapped around a layer of jali screens shaping into an external courtyard near the sit-out. This was an attempt to merge the existing predominant site feature seamlessly with the introduced built environment.






The clients had a very clear and comprehensible vision of their dream abode right from the first meeting, with their requirements being simple yet relevant- a well-lit and ventilated home with an open layout that would complement their contemporary lifestyle.

The linear plot had access points from both south and west sides being flanked by connecting roads on either of those sides. The main entrance was proposed from the south side to maintain linearity in design. The chosen muted palette for the exterior was a complementing response to the surrounding morphology with



residences on all four sides of the plot. The white colour plays its magic by capturing one's whole attention to the building without being too loud or demanding. The subtle tint of greys given for the sunshades and fresh greenery stirs well with the white and augments the whole composition. The porous treatment of the front facade with MS mesh and the jali screening behind it stamps the character of the design right from the first glance. This softens the building boundaries enhancing the welcoming appeal without compromising much security.

This 2020 sqft residence was designed in an open concept with minimal walls used for drawing boundaries between spaces. The car porch is integrated well with the design having linear steps on its one side leading to a sit-out that looks into the Mango tree courtyard. A small linear water body on its side adds to the freshness of the landscape. All the public spaces including living, dining and kitchen are designed to act cohesively without an evident barrier for demarcation. Courtyards bearing greenery are juxtaposed between the spaces, making sure they are in constant conversation with the landscape and building context. The living and dining spaces are aligned in a line with a breathing core between them, leading to an open kitchen at the end. The large courtyard spaced between staircase and breakfast counter pours in ample amount of light and fresh air to the interior with the aid of skylight and double-height jali walls on either side.



Manuraj C R leads i2a Achitects Studio as the principal architect. At i2A, the team craft designs that not only reflect their brimming passion towards architecture but also their commitment towards innovating practical solutions to the challenges of the clients. They encourage their clients to do what they do the best, to dream without inhibitions. Then the team gets to work doing what they do the best, transforming the idea into designs that house their bigger dreams.





Cross ventilation is enabled throughout with large sliding windows and porous jali screens adequately placed on walls. Vertical spatial connection is maintained with double-height courtyard spaces acting as communication cores. The house has three bedrooms, one on the ground floor and the rest on the upper floor, each of them provided with either large sliding doors or windows ensuring appropriate cross ventilation.











The interior colour palette was chosen corresponding to the overall theme of the house, with shades of grey, beige and white being the notable colours. The tint of green from the courtyards complements perfectly the theme that embodies lightness and openness. The minimal theme extends to the furniture design as well, predominantly made of mahogany wood tinted to a light pine shade. Inbuilt seating provisions in the living room and upper corridor perform as storage units as well, translating the simplicity of the design language into practice. The material palette explores the raw textural qualities of each of the elements used, that is to say- MS sheets and wire mesh used for staircase, Nano white stone as counter/dining table tops, small swathes of cobblestones and baby metal laid in the courtyard. All of them are presented as it is without layers of extra modification or coating thus staying true to the design intended.

n office is a 'man cave' for the architect which manifests his life, his inner likings and amplifies his aura as a person. It is a space for his team, his family and friends and for the people who want to utilize his expertise. It is a platform that facilitates the exchange of ideas, learning, gatherings, leisure, work and living. It is a place that perfectly fits him to build as a person and as an Architect. It is a casual setup for the team which suggests a homely but meditative space to keep maintaining the creative mood. The designer metamorphosed the wholesome objective to find that unique out of the box element, ideology and philosophy in the design of 'The Violet'- Architects Office.

The envelope is designed as a simple rectangle in the planar level, echoing the shape of the site with a south

entry. The building is placed linearly parallel to the east-west direction; this ensures minimum exposure to the harsh sun. The linear orientation of the building in the east-west, with openings flanking the width of the building, allows an ever-changing mood of natural lighting inside the space and induces cross ventilation. The east light in the morning navigates right through the entire length of the building and vice-versa with the dawn west light.








The plan has minimum external walls and no internal partitions. It is a single-floor room with two mezzanine floors at the east and west ends. While the ground level inculcates 12 workstations, it has a south-entry foyer right next to the main door conceiving a waiting lounge and the admin desk. The mezzanine on the west has a mini pantry accessed through a spiral staircase and the one in the east has the Architects' space.



Nestcraft Architecture, A Calicut-Kerala based Architectural studio. established in 2012, is been founded by Rohit Palakkal. Nestcraft office is a boutique design studio which has multidisciplinary members of professionals and focuses on the design and execution of Architecture, Interiors, landscape, allied design and Engineering. 


Initial Concept Sketch of Hanging Lamp






he boutique stands on one of the main streets of Ranchi. With a frontage of 40 feet, the facade sets itself apart from the rest of the street elevation and drives the design process to create this experimental yet harmonious setup of the design experience.

The designer approached us intending to create a boutique space that complements her fashion design style classy yet bold with meticulous attention to detail. The flows of fabrics are reflected in the false ceiling. The attention to detail is apparent in the feature wall and the bespoke furniture which, ever so subtly ties the whole space together without overpowering the identity of the boutique. The colour palette ties to merge the opulence of grand festivities with the earthy and muted tones of a homegrown fashion boutique, connected to its roots and heritage. The choice of furniture fitting and light fixtures is also deliberate and in sync with the overall theme.







The whole boutique is spatially divided into major areas- the boutique showroom on the northern side and the support spaces, including the designer's cabin on the southern side. Part of the decision was influenced by Vaastu principles.

As one enters the boutique, one can see the latest designs on display in the display area, behind which is the designer's cabin. The space is anchored by a large free-flowing centre table, ideal for showing new outfits and fabrics to customers or brainstorming on new designs. The south-eastern side of the boutique floor is flanked by a feature wall that acts as a backdrop for photoshoots and also provides visual privacy for the support areas.

The false ceiling is an exercise in fluid parametricism, reflecting the sway of fabric. The MDF ceiling is an assembly of 29 rows, each divided into 3 parts.





The feature walls behind the display area and the photoshoot area are punctuated by elements made of moulded plaster. Traditional motifs are used throughout in keeping with the style of the designer.

The metal mesh storefront mimics the design of the false ceiling inside and adds character to the street elevation.

# All-round Radiance H.M. Residence, Vadodara, Gujarat



he clients wanted to renovate their existing property in a modern way to up their standard of living. To design a luxury home in a contemporary aesthetic, the design firm decided to go with a classy colour palette.

The entrance foyer features a geometric pattern, custom printed glass shutters on the surfaces along a teak wood veneer frame. The upper and lower cabinet is done in a glass finish and the niche adorns a bright blue texture paint to offer a subtle boldness to the overall transitional space.

The living area integrates the dining area and seating area crowned by an oak wood veneer finished ceiling with geometric patterns and profile





led lights to foster a dramatic environment. In the seating area, a textured feature wall and matte black finished cylinder track lights add drama to the volume. The drawers on the TV unit in a custom printed glass finish, the brass-plated centre table and the glass finish tripod lamp with green fabric and wooden legs models a modernistic look across the board.

A circular mirror, a vertical patterned panel in wood and PU paint, a patterned partition to divide it from the living area, and a chic hanging light enhances the beauty of the wash area.





In the kitchen area, the designers chose white composite stone as a countertop material and aquamarine toned glass for the backsplash to add freshness to the working space. The overhead storage is finished in frosted glass and veneer.

A neutral grey tone with a wood finish was selected as a core theme for the parents' bedroom located on the ground floor. A checkered, textured ceiling runs along with the top of the bed area to add to the sophisticated, clean-lined decor.






In the master bedroom, a full-height headboard with NuWood panels creates geometrical patterns in two different shades of PU paint on the surface. Furthermore, the hanging lamp adds dynamism to the room, while bright blue-toned furnishing, oval-shaped dressing mirror on a veneered pattern panel, vertical storage units, wardrobe matching the headboard, the pelmet with cove lights and the rich curtain fabric come together to frame an elegant design. The bathroom sports a dark colour theme. White stone countertop with storage finished in wooden laminate, rustic antique-finish tiles on the wall to highlight the basin area, and a niche in the shower area adds vivacity to the bathroom.

The office-cum-seating area on the first floor is designed as a 'striped space' by using four different natural and composite stone marbles on the floor, creating an abstract look. 
